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#### Independent Auditor's Report

To the Members of DIVYA SOFTWARE SOLUTIONS PRIVATE LIMITED Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of *DIVYA SOFTWARE SOLUTIONS PRIVATE LIMITED*, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at

March 31, 2017, the Statement of Profit and Loss and the Cash flow statement for the Period then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.
